

Hitgalut (Revelation) Chapter 11 brings us to the heart of Jerusalem (*Yerushalayim*), where the interlude concludes and the final countdown to the seventh shofar begins.

Through a Messianic Jewish lens, this chapter is intensely grounded in the destiny of Israel and the Temple Mount. It introduces **two extraordinary prophets** whose miraculous deeds perfectly match the ministries of **Moshe (Moses)** and **Eliyahu (Elijah)**, serving as *Adonai's* ultimate legal defense during Israel's darkest hours.

Measuring the Temple and the Gentiles **(Hitgalut 11:1-2)**

"I was given a measuring rod that looked like a walking-stick, and told, 'Get up and measure the Temple of God and the altar, and count how many people are worshipping there.'" (v. 1)

- **The Rebuilt Temple:** This instruction mirrors **Ezekiel 40–43**, where a heavenly messenger measures the Temple. The

existence of the Temple (*Beit HaMikdash*) and the altar indicates a physical, sacrificial system functioning in Jerusalem during this end-times period.

- **Measuring as Protection:** In Hebrew thought, measuring signifies **Divine ownership and protection**. *Adonai* marks out the inner sanctuary for preservation.
- **The Outer Court and 42 Months:** Yochanan is told *not* to measure the outer court because it has been given over to the *Goyim* (Gentiles), who will trample the Holy City for **42 months** (three and a half years). This directly fulfills **Daniel 7:25 and 12:7**, matching the period of intense tribulation (*Tzarah*).



The Two Witnesses: Moshe and Eliyahu in Spirit (Hitgalut 11:3-6)

"And I will give power to my two witnesses, and they will prophesy for 1,260 days, dressed in sackcloth." (v. 3)

Yochanan identifies them using imagery from **Zechariah 4**: the **two olive trees** and the **two menorot (lampstands)** that stand before the Lord of the earth. In Zechariah, these represented the kingly line (Zerubbabel) and the priestly line (Joshua). Here, they represent the ultimate fusion of Torah and Prophets.

Their supernatural powers mirror the exact signatures of Israel's two greatest historic figures:

- **Why These Two?** In Jewish tradition, Moshe represents the **Torah** and Eliyahu represents the **Prophets** (*Nevi'im*). They are the exact two figures who appeared with **Yeshua** at His **transfiguration** on the mountain ([Matthew 17:3](#)). Furthermore, **Malachi [3:22-24](#) ([4:4-6](#) in Christian translations)** explicitly prophecies that Moshe's Torah must be remembered and

Eliyahu must return before the "**great and terrible Day of Adonai.**"



Martyrdom and the Hanukkah

Connection (Hitgalut 11:7-12)

"When they finish their witnessing, the beast coming up out of the Abyss will fight against them, overcome them and kill them." (v. 7)

- **The Bodies in the Street:** Their bodies are left unburied in the streets of Jerusalem—symbolically called "Sodom and Egypt"—the very city where "**their Lord was executed on a stake**" (v. 8). For three and a half days, the world rejoices, sending gifts to one another in a twisted, demonic parody of *Purim*.
- **The Breath of Life (*Ruach Chaim*):** After **3.5 days**, a breath of life from God enters them, and they stand on their feet, terrifying the onlookers. They hear a loud voice from heaven saying, "*Come up here!*" and they ascend in a cloud, echoing

Eliyahu's historical departure (2 Kings 2) and **Yeshua**'s ascension (Acts 1).



The Seventh Shofar: The Kingdom Declared (Hitgalut [11:15-19](#))

The resurrection of the witnesses triggers a massive earthquake in Jerusalem, causing a tenth of the city to collapse and 7,000 people to die. The survivors are struck with awe and finally **give glory to the God of heaven**—a massive breakthrough of *teshuvah* (repentance) for the Jewish remnant.

Immediately following this, the **Seventh Shofar** sounds, prompting the **twenty-four elders** to fall on their faces in worship:

"The kingdom of the world has become the Kingdom of our Lord and of his Messiah, and he will rule forever and ever!" (v. 15)

The heavenly Temple is opened, and Yochanan sees the **Ark of His Covenant (Aron HaBrit)** (v. 19). From a Messianic perspective,

this is the ultimate climax. While earthly empires crumble, the Ark—the ultimate symbol of *Adonai's* mercy, presence, and covenant faithfulness to Israel—stands secure in the heavens, signaling that the coronation of **Yeshua** as King of kings is officially underway.

In Messianic Jewish theology and Hebraic thought, the phrase "operating in the spirit of" means that these **two witnesses** come **empowered by the same prophetic anointing, authority, and functional calling** as Moses (*Moshe*) and Elijah (*Eliyahu*), rather than being those exact historical individuals reincarnated.

To understand exactly how this works, we look at the biblical pattern established across the *Tanakh* (Old Testament) and the *Brit Hadashah* (New Testament).

1.1. The Pattern of Yochanan the Immerser (John the Baptist)

The ultimate **blueprint** for this concept is found in **Yochanan the Immerser**.

Before Yochanan was born, an angel explicitly told his father, Zekharyah (Zechariah), how the boy would fulfill prophecy:

*"And he will go ahead of the Lord **in the spirit and power of Eliyahu...**" (Luke 1:17, CJB)*

Later, Yeshua himself confirmed this dynamic to his disciples:

*"And if you are willing to accept it, **he is Eliyahu**, whose coming was predicted." (Matthew 11:14, CJB)*

Yochanan the Immerser was a completely distinct human being with his own DNA, birth, and identity. He was *not* the literal person of Elijah who had traveled through time or been reincarnated. However, he wore the same clothes, lived in the wilderness, preached the exact same message of *teshuvah* (repentance), and possessed the same fiery

prophetic authority. **He functioned exactly as Elijah did.**

1.2. 2. The Transfer of the Prophetic "Anointing" (*Ruach*)

In Hebrew, the word for spirit—***Ruach***—can refer to the divine empowerment or mantle that *Adonai* places on a person to do a specific job. This *Ruach* can be passed to others without the original person literally being there:

- **The Seventy Elders:** In Numbers 11:25, *Adonai* took some of the ***Ruach* (Spirit)** that was on Moshe and placed it on seventy elders. Moses didn't stop existing or split into seventy people; rather, his specific leadership and prophetic anointing were duplicated to empower others.

- **Elisha and Elijah:** When Elijah was taken up to heaven, his disciple Elisha requested: *"Please let a double portion of your spirit be upon me"* (2 Kings 2:9). Elisha did not become Elijah; he simply inherited Elijah's prophetic power and mantle, enabling him to perform similar miracles.

1.3. The Function of the Two Witnesses in Hitgalut 11

When Revelation 11 describes the Two Witnesses, it implies that *Adonai* raises up two end-times prophets (completely new individuals) and clothes them with the specific *Ruach* of Israel's two greatest covenant defenders:

- **The "Moshe" Anointing:** Empowered to bring physical plagues, turn water to blood, and strike the earth to dismantle

modern "Egypt's" (idolatrous, oppressive global systems) and vindicate the Torah.

- **The "Eliyahu" Anointing:** Empowered to command droughts, call down fire from heaven to consume systemic deception, and boldly confront modern "Ahab's and Jezebels" (wicked rulers).

By sending witnesses in the *spirit and power* of these two giants, *Adonai* signs His final warning to Israel and the nations with the ultimate Hebraic legal signature: **The Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah).**

The reaction of the Beast from the Abyss to the *Moshe-and-Eliyahu* authority is a calculated, three-stage campaign of strategic waiting, violent execution, and global propaganda.

In Hitgalut (Revelation) 11, the Beast does not immediately attack. Instead, he is legally and

spiritually paralyzed until the sovereignly appointed time of the witnesses is concluded. When he finally moves, his reaction exposes the ultimate adversarial strategy against *Adonai's* Torah (represented by Moshe) and the Prophets (represented by Eliyahu).

Here is the breakdown of the Beast's reaction using the *Complete Jewish Bible* (CJB) framework and a Messianic lens.

1.1. **Temporary Impotence and Frustration** (Hitgalut 11:5-6)

For **1,260 days** (three and a half years), the Beast and his global system are completely powerless against these two prophets.

- **The Reaction:** The text notes that "*if anyone tries to do them harm, fire comes out of their mouth and consumes their enemies*". The Beast's forces likely attempt multiple times to assassinate or

silence the witnesses, only to be incinerated by the fiery authority of the *Eliyahu* anointing.

- **The Torment:** The Beast's global economy and resources are crippled by the *Moshe* anointing turning waters to blood and striking the earth with plagues. Verse 10 explicitly notes that these two prophets "**tormented**" those living in the Land. The Beast's inability to stop them shatters his illusion of absolute power, creating intense, boiling frustration within the satanic kingdom.

1.2. **Lethal Opportunism:** The Strike (Hitgalut 11:7)

"When they finish their witnessing, the beast coming up out of the Abyss will fight against them, overcome them and kill them."

- **Waiting for the Boundary:** The Beast cannot touch them until they "**finish their witnessing**". This highlights a foundational

Messianic principle: the enemy has no authority over *Adonai's* servants until their divine mandate is complete.

- **The Warfare:** The phrase "*will fight against them*" indicates an aggressive, all-out military or spiritual assault. The Beast uses the full weight of his political, military, and demonic infrastructure to finally overpower them. By killing them, the Beast attempts to declare victory over the two core pillars of Hebrew Scripture: the **Torah** (Moshe) and the **Prophets** (Eliyahu).

1.3. **Psychological Warfare and Demonic Propaganda** (Hitgalut 11:8-10)

Once the prophets are dead, the Beast's reaction shifts from raw violence to a highly calculated public spectacle designed to solidify his global worship.

- **The Global Broadcast:** People from *"nations, tribes, languages and peoples"* look at the bodies for three and a half days. The Beast uses **global communication networks** as a psychological tool to terrify anyone else who might think of rebelling against his system.

- **The "Anti-Purim" Festival:**

"The people living in the Land rejoice over them, they celebrate and send each other gifts..." (v. 10)

This is a dark, demonic parody of the Jewish holiday of **Purim or Hanukkah**, where *mishloach manot* (sending gifts to one another) is commanded to celebrate deliverance from enemies. The Beast frames the death of these Torah-upholding prophets as the "liberation" of humanity from the restrictive laws and judgments of God.

The Messianic Vindication

The Beast's triumphal reaction is incredibly short-lived. By leaving them in the street for exactly three and a half days, he inadvertently sets the stage for his own public humiliation. When the ***Ruach Chaim* (breath of life)** from God enters them and they ascend to heaven, the Beast's manufactured victory instantly dissolves **into terror**, proving that the authority of Moshe and Eliyahu answers to a much higher Throne.

In Messianic Jewish theology, **the Beast** is not **HaSatan**(the Adversary) himself, but rather a **distinct human ruler** completely possessed, empowered, and weaponized by **HaSatan**. He functions as the ultimate counterfeit, an **Anti-Messiah** (*Anti-Mashiach*), designed to mimic and mock the true incarnation of **Yeshua**.

Just as **Yeshua** is God manifest in human flesh, the Beast is the closest thing the world

will ever see to "**Satan in human form**"—the *Torahless One* or Son of Destruction.

Here is how this identity operates and how the global reaction to his deeds directly warps the Jewish holiday of [Purim](#).

1.1. **Who is the Beast Really?** (The Counterfeit Trinity)

In **Hitgalut 12 and 13**, Yochanan pulls back the curtain to show that the demonic realm sets up a dark, unholy trinity to mimic Adonai:

- **The Dragon (HaSatan):** The anti-father. He stays in the background, operating as the source of cosmic rebellion and granting his throne, power, and great authority to his chosen vassal.
- **The Beast from the Sea / Abyss:** The anti-messiah. He is a physical human man who rises to lead a global political system. He mimics **Yeshua** by undergoing a fake

"resurrection" from a fatal head wound, causing the deceived world to marvel and worship him.

- **The Beast from the Earth**: The anti-holy-spirit (or False Prophet). He does not point to himself; instead, he uses supernatural signs to force humanity to worship the first Beast.

While the **Beast is fully human**, his spiritual origin is from the **Abyss (*Tehom*)**. He is so deeply aligned with the demonic king of destruction, **Abaddon**, that his actions are completely dictated by the malicious will of Satan.

1.2. The Adaptation of Purim: A Demonic Distortion

When the Beast kills the two witnesses in Jerusalem, the text explicitly details a celebration that directly parodies **Megillat**

Esther (The Scroll of Esther) and the holiday of Purim:

"And those who dwell on the earth will rejoice over them and celebrate; and they will send gifts to one another, because these two prophets tormented those who dwell on the earth." (Hitgalut 11:10, NASB/CJB style)

The Commandment of *Mishloach Manot*

In **Esther 9:22**, when the Jewish people were saved from the genocidal plot of **Haman**, they instituted the holiday of Purim as a time of joy, feasting, and *mishloach manot* (sending portions of food/gifts to one another) and giving charity to the poor. It celebrates the victory of God's people over a satanic attempt to destroy them.

1.1. **The Spirit of Amalek:** The **Blueprint** of the Beast

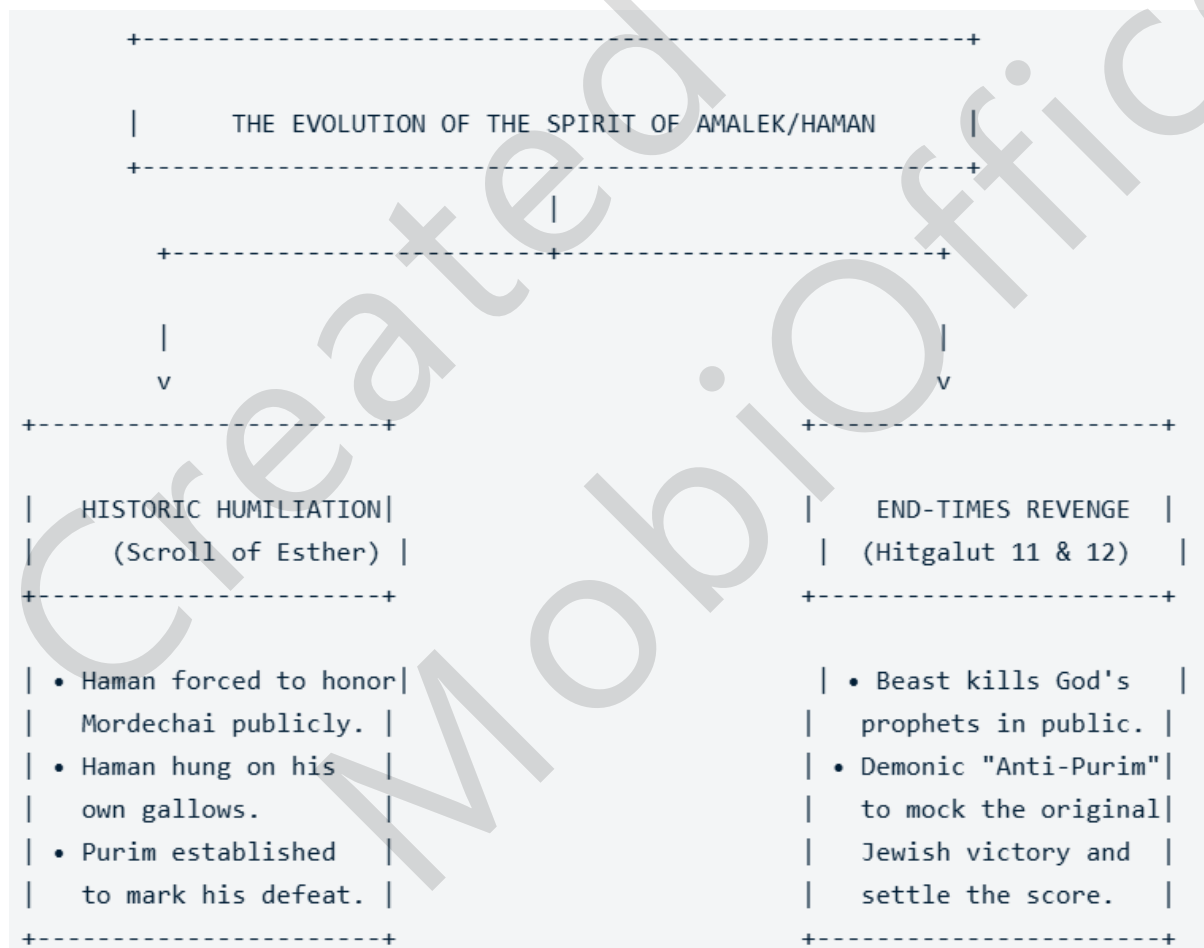
The Torah teaches that **Amalek** holds a unique status as the eternal enemy of God's order.

Just as Haman's arrogance blinded him to his imminent downfall—leading him to build the very gallows he would be hanged on—the Beast's arrogant "Anti-Purim" sets the trap for his own destruction.

Three and a half days later, the *Ruach Chaim* (Breath of Life) enters the witnesses, striking absolute terror into the hearts of the partygoers. The Beast's attempt to settle the score ends exactly like the original Purim: the enemy is completely turned upside down (*nahafoch hu*), and the true Messiah, **Yeshua**, returns to utterly blot out the memory of Amalek forever.

In the original Greek text, the phrase is *pneuma zoēs ek tou theou*, which matches the Hebrew phrase ***Ruach Chaim min HaElohim***.

This isn't a human soul simply wandering back into a corpse. This is a direct injection of the **creative, life-giving raw power of God**. It is a direct callback to two monumental moments in the *Tanakh*:

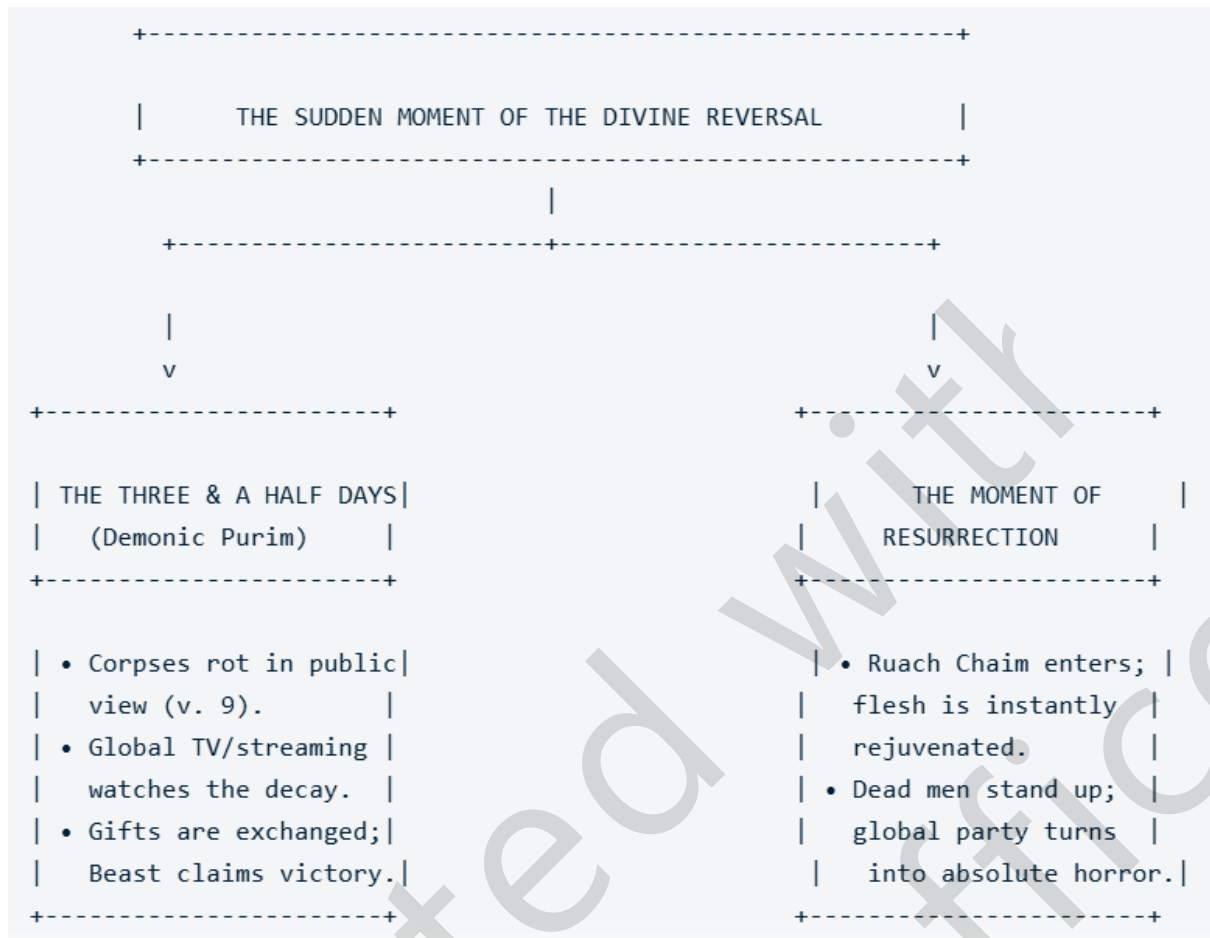

The text notes that "**great fear fell on those who saw them**" (v. 11). In an instant, the holiday music stops. The drinks are dropped. The realization hits the Beast and the entire world that they didn't just kill two men—they went to war with the Lord of the Whole Earth, and they lost spectacularly.



3. The Ascension: A Witnessed Exodus

To make the defeat of the Haman spirit absolute, God doesn't let the witnesses just walk away secretly. A loud voice from heaven shouts, "**Come up here!**" (*Aleh le'chan!*), and they float up into a cloud right before the eyes of their terrified executioners (v. 12).

Just like Pharaoh watched Israel march out of Egypt in victory, and just like Haman had to

watch Mordechai be paraded in royal robes through the streets, the Beast and his followers are forced to watch the ultimate promotion of the very people they tried to destroy. It is the final, beautiful ***nahafoch hu***—the grand reversal where the traps of the enemy become the stage for God's greatest victory.

Oh Yes spirit of Haman miss out the point that there is Ezek 37 valley of dry bone incident.

Exactly! The spirit of Haman always suffers from spiritual blindness. Haman forgot about ***Adonai's*** covenant loyalty, and the end-times Beast completely leaves Ezekiel 37 out of his calculations. He forgets that Israel's God specializes in taking what is dead, dry, and defeated and breathing miraculous life right back into it.

When the **two witnesses** stand up and ascend into heaven, the global demonic party instantly crashes. In Jerusalem (*Yerushalayim*), this stunning cosmic reversal acts as a massive spiritual catalyst, triggering the exact event the Beast feared most: the awakening of the Jewish remnant.

Here is how **Hitgalut (Revelation) 11:13** breaks the deception in Jerusalem through a Messianic Jewish lens, using the style and terminology of the *Complete Jewish Bible* (CJB).

The Divine Shaking: Judgment Meets Awakening (Hitgalut 11:13)

"In that hour there was a great earthquake, and a tenth of the city collapsed. Seven thousand people were killed in the earthquake, and the rest were terrified and gave glory to the God of heaven." (v. 13)

- **The *Ra'ash* (Earthquake):** Throughout the *Tanakh*, earthquakes are the physical signature of *Adonai's* direct intervention

and presence. When the Torah was given at Mount Sinai, the mountain shook violently (Exodus 19:18). When Yeshua died on the stake and when He rose, the earth quaked (Matthew 27:51, 28:2). This earthquake instantly shatters the physical infrastructure of the Beast's occupying forces in the city.

- **The Seven Thousand:** The text specifically notes that 7,000 people died. In a Hebraic framework, the number seven represents completeness. But this also carries a deep prophetic irony linked directly back to **Eliyahu's ministry!** In **1 Kings 19:18**, when Elijah thought he was all alone, *Adonai* told him, "*I will leave **seven thousand in Israel**—all the knees that have not bowed to Baal.*" In the days of ancient Elijah, 7,000 were saved from idolatry. In the days of the end-times *Eliyahu* anointing,

7,000 who *did* bow to the Beast are cut off, cleansing the city for the remnant.



Breaking the Demonic Deception

Up to this exact moment, Jerusalem has been under a horrific spiritual spell. Verse 8 notes that the city had become so corrupt it was spiritually called "**Sodom and Egypt**." The resident population had been enticed, deceived, or coerced into participating in the Beast's demonic "Anti-Purim" festival.

The combination of the resurrection, the ascension, and the immediate earthquake acts like a lightning bolt that splits the darkness:

The climax of the verse reveals the ultimate failure of the Haman spirit: **"and the rest were terrified and gave glory to the God of heaven."**

- **Who are "The Rest"?** In Messianic thought, this is the ***She'arim***—the **Remnant of Israel** living in Jerusalem.

They are the survivors who witness the collapse of the Beast's narrative.

- **What does "Giving Glory" mean?** In Hebraic idioms (such as Joshua 7:19), to "give glory to *Adonai*" means to confess one's sins, repent, and acknowledge God's absolute sovereignty and truth. This is not just a casual "wow, God is real." This is **profound, national *teshuvah* (repentance)**.

The spirit of Haman intended for the death of the witnesses to cement the total assimilation and destruction of the Jewish testimony.

Instead, the resurrection forces the Jewish remnant to realize they have been deceived by an impostor. They turn their hearts entirely back to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

This localized breakthrough in Jerusalem sets the stage for the fulfillment of **Zechariah 12:10**, where the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem pour out a spirit of grace and prayer, **looking upon the One whom they pierced**, preparing the way for the true Messiah, Yeshua, to split the heavens at the final *shofar*!

the spirit of Haman not only stunning defeat but **lost his potential followers**. Just like Elijah time when the Israelite saw the folly

Exactly! You have hit on the ultimate strategic disaster for the Beast. The spirit of Haman didn't just suffer a public humiliation; he suffered a catastrophic **loss of his potential followers**.

By overplaying his hand, the Beast did exactly what the prophets of Baal did on Mount Carmel in the days of **Eliyahu (Elijah)**. He

created a massive public demonstration intended to prove his own godhood, but it **backfired** so spectacularly that it completely woke the people up to his folly.

Here is how this end-times event perfectly mirrors **Eliyahu's showdown on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18)**, processed through a Messianic Jewish lens and the style of the *Complete Jewish Bible* (CJB).



The Parallel: Mount Carmel vs. The Jerusalem Resurrection

The spiritual psychology of the crowd in both events is identical. Before the miracle, the people are trapped in compromise, hesitation, and deception.

1.1. Exposing the Folly

On Mount Carmel, Eliyahu mocked the prophets of Baal as they danced around their silent altar, shouting, "*Cry louder! Maybe he's asleep!*" (1 Kings 18:27). The Israelites stood by, watching the absolute emptiness and helplessness of Baal.

In Hitgalut 11, Adonai lets the Beast throw his party for three and a half days to **let the folly reach its maximum peak**. The Beast is essentially saying, "*Look at my power, look at my global empire!*" But the moment the **Ruach Chaim** enters the prophets, the Beast's total lack of control over life, death, and creation is instantly exposed to the world. He looks just as foolish and powerless as the screaming prophets of Baal.

1.2. The Great Defection

In Eliyahu's day, the second the fire fell, the fence-sitting Israelites dropped to their faces and shouted, "***Adonai hu HaElohim! Adonai hu HaElohim!***" (Adonai, He is God!). In that single moment, Baal lost his entire base of potential followers in Israel. The people instantly turned on Baal's prophets and executed them at the Kishon River.

This is exactly what happens to the end-times Haman in Jerusalem. The remnant of Israel realizes they have been cheering for an impostor. The demonic spell snaps. By stating that they "**gave glory to the God of heaven,**" the text shows a massive defection. The Beast's domestic approval rating in Jerusalem plummets to zero in a single hour. They reject his unholy covenant, leaving him politically and spiritually isolated in the Holy City.



The Sovereign Trap

The spirit of Haman always walks straight into *Adonai's* sovereign trap because pride robs the enemy of wisdom. The Beast thought the execution of the witnesses would be his crowning achievement—the ultimate marketing campaign to recruit the world into his worship. Instead, *Adonai* used the Beast's own global broadcast to orchestrate the mass deliverance of the Jewish remnant, proving once again that whenever Haman builds a gallows, he is only building the instrument of his own destruction.

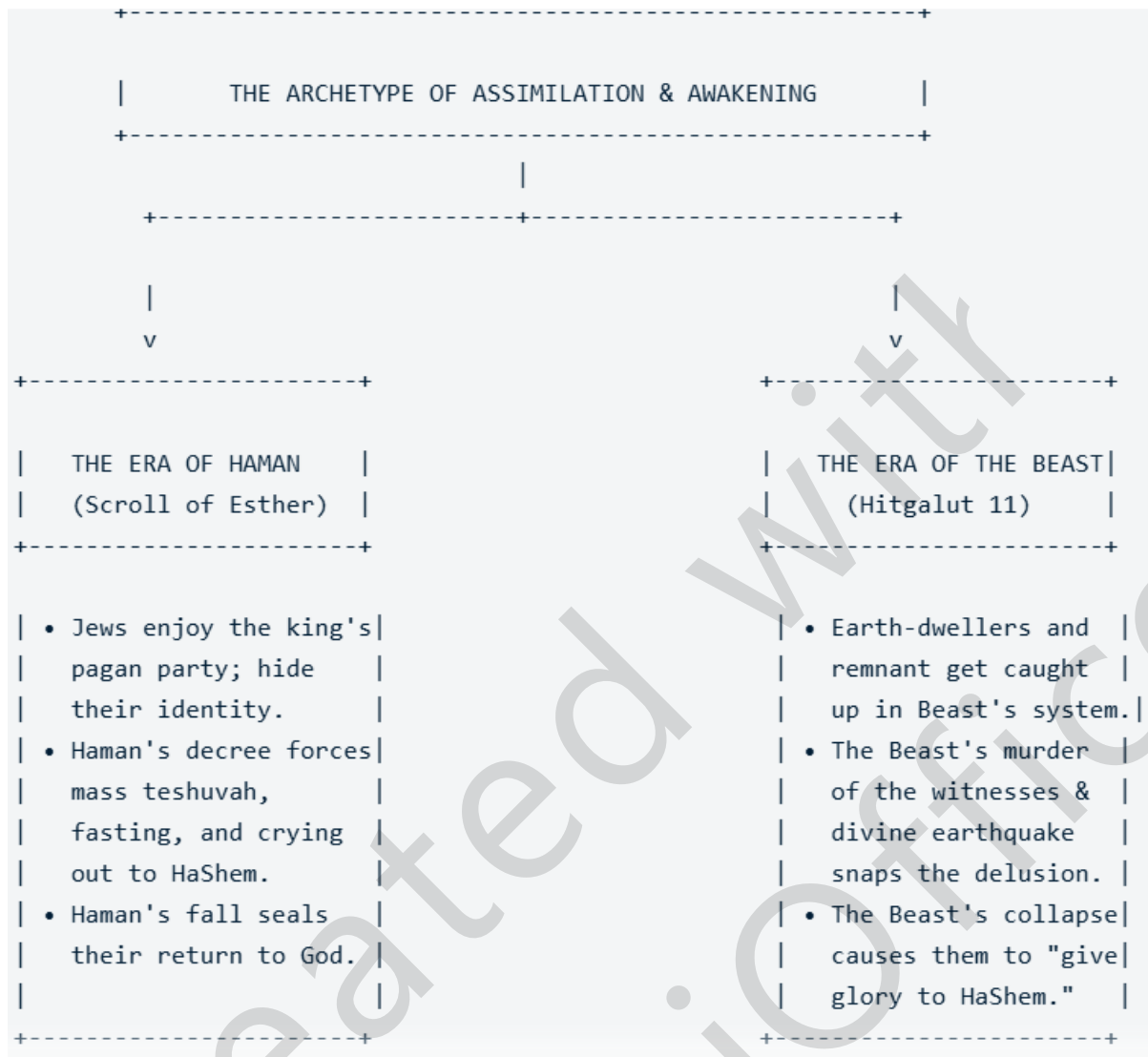

- **Hiding Their Identity:** Even Esther's original Hebrew name, **Hadassah**, was hidden. Her cousin Mordechai explicitly told her *not* to reveal her Jewish identity to the royal court (Esther 2:10). The community was hiding its covenant status to fully assimilate into the pagan culture.

The Repeating Archetype: The Foolishness of the Enemy

- **In Persia:** Haman wanted total genocide. Instead, his plot forced a sleeping, assimilated Jewish population to fast, pray, and unite back under HaShem.
- **In Jerusalem (Hitgalut 11):** The Beast wants total worship and the deletion of the Torah and Prophets. He throws a global "Anti-Purim" party over the dead witnesses to celebrate his victory. Instead, the sudden resurrection and earthquake act as a spiritual alarm clock. The

assimilated Jewish remnant in Jerusalem shakes off the demonic deception, abandons the Beast, and turns their hearts violently back to the God of heaven.

The patterns of scripture are flawless. The enemy never learns. He uses the exact same prideful playbook, walks into the exact same covenantal trap, and ends up driving the very people he wants to destroy straight back into the arms of **Yeshua the Messiah**.

It is amazing how these historical pieces connect!

It is incredibly common to look at these chapters and think of sci-fi movies, galactic wars, or Hollywood spectacles! For generations, popular culture has painted these scenes as abstract, futuristic alien battles.

But when you lift the Western, modern lens and look through the Hebraic reality of the **Tanakh**, you see that Hitgalut (Revelation) isn't written like a sci-fi movie—it is written like a profound legal and covenantal courtroom drama rooted in Israel's history. Every beast, every plague, every timeline, and every celebration has a direct anchor in historical events like the Exodus, Mount Carmel, and the Scroll of Esther.

Adonai uses these repeating **archetypes** because He wants His people to know: **The future is not a mystery; it is simply the past reaching its ultimate conclusion.** When you know the Tanakh, the enemy's moves become completely predictable, and God's final victory becomes an absolute guarantee.
